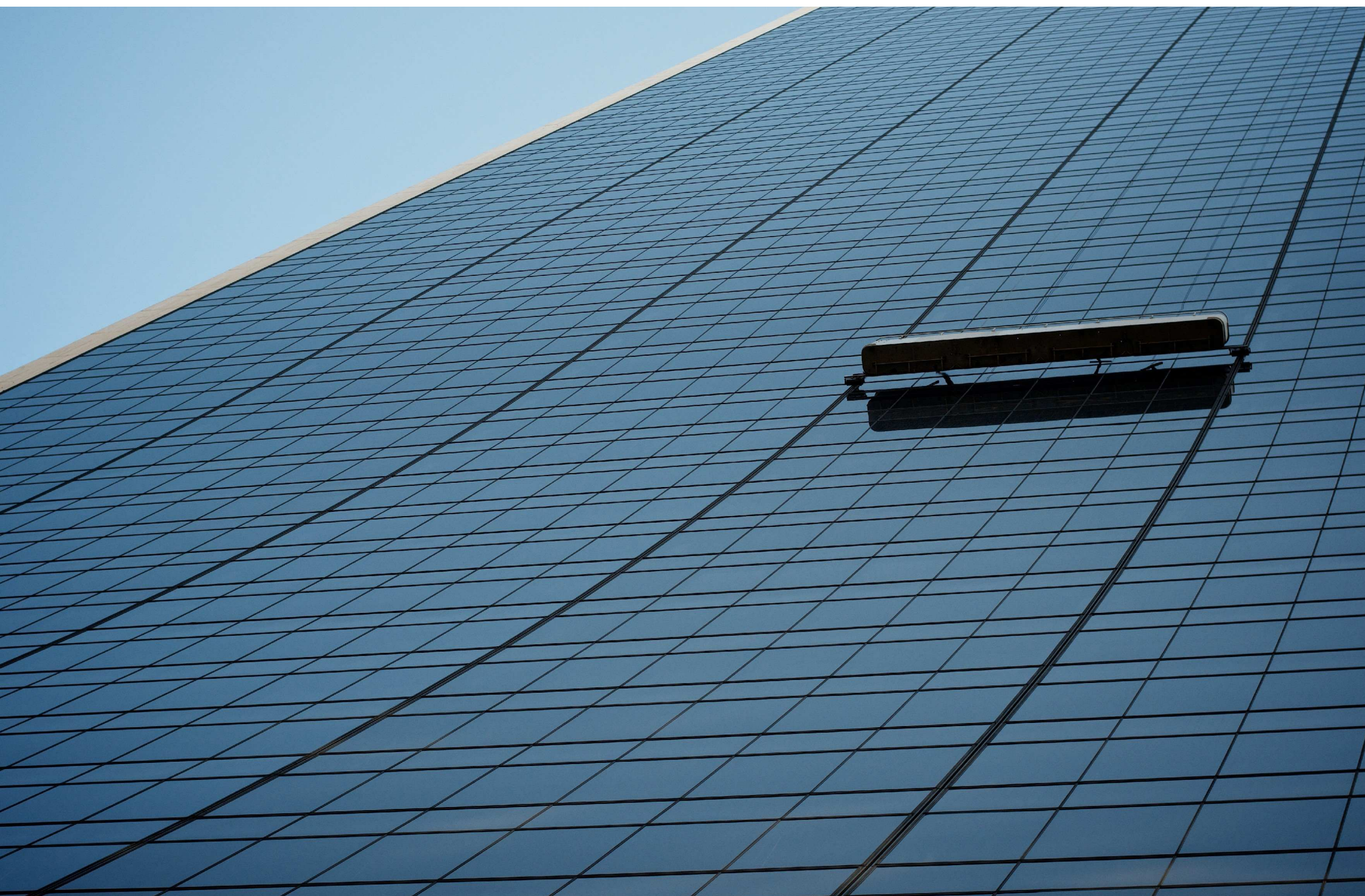

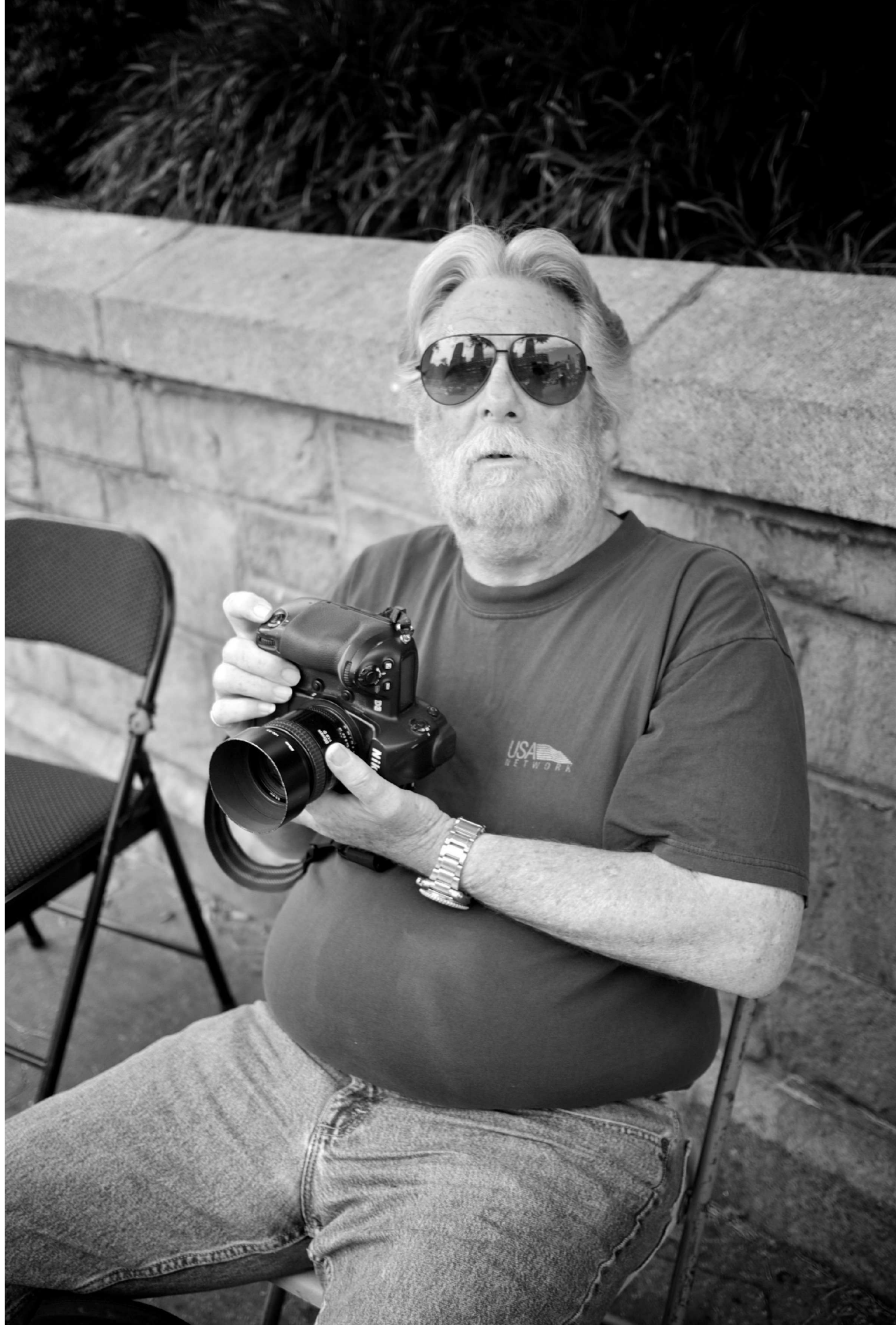


















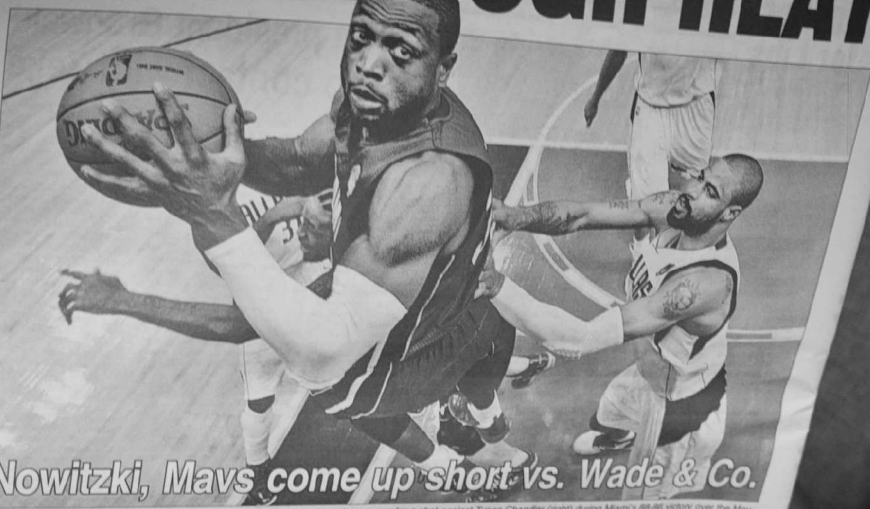

JUST ENOUGH HEAT



Nowitzki, Mavs come up short vs. Wade & Co.

DALLAS — Dirk Nowitzki did everything possible for the Mavs. Except hit his final shot. But credit Miami's Udonis Haslem for that. After carrying the Mavs through the endgame with a gutsy display that included the last 12 Dallas points, Nowitzki found only the back iron with his familiar turnaround shot, coming from 16 feet and in the teeth of some ferocious one-on-one defense. For Haslem at the final buzzer, So the Heat, behind 29 points from Dwyane Wade, claimed a 2-1 NBA Finals advantage with an 80-66 Game 3 victory here last night.

"The look with four seconds to go, I think was as good as you can get," said

Nowitzki, who scored 34 points — 12 of them in the final quarter. "Haslem has frustrated me everywhere trying to keep the ball out of my hands. He stayed down and made me shoot a contested shot. A shot I can't make but it didn't go."

And on the Heat, he deemed themselves for their own Game 2 endgame collapse while the Mavs failed to build on the momentum of that encouraging victory.

We felt you can't lose a game like that and then lose the next," said Wade, who also had 11 rebounds in an animated, spirited game-long performance. "We felt this was a must-win. Personally, I've moved on from this win already. We got the homecourt back."

All game, the Heat, with Wade seemingly every-

where, built comfortable leads. And all game, the Mavs pulled back. In the first half, a 14-point Miami lead became five. In the third quarter, a 12-point advantage morphed into a

one-point Dallas lead. "We were digging out of holes all night. We'd get it real and then a minute later we're digging out again," said Dallas coach Rick Carlisle.

In the fourth, Wade hit a 3-pointer at 6:11 to put Miami up, seven. So Nowitzki went on his personal crusade, the drive. He hit six free throws. He took a spectacular pass from Jason Kidd (10 assists) for a driving dunk. He sank a 12-footer to tie at 80-80 with 1:41 left.

"He knows he's going to have to carry a certain load, not just a scoring load," Carlisle said. "We'd like to make it easier for him."

But that was not the case last night. LeBron James (17 points, nine assists) missed when he tried to drive a foot — there was contact,

go, call what that a 24-second violation. But Jason Terry (12 points) for Dallas before scoring 18 in Game 3, delivered the decisive score. Rush took James' final assist and struck a 10-footer from the left corner, a shot he had panned up moments before.

"It's all about timing, man. I saw CJ (Rush) wide open and I don't care if he'd missed it in a year," James said. "That's the kind of trust we have."

Nowitzki, against a double team, threw the ball away before James missed a 3-pointer and Dallas rebounded at 4:44 scoring up Nowitzki's try to tie. Kidd rebounded it. Nowitzki With Haslem all over him,

inside the final line offensively. Nowitzki turned, shot. And hit the back rim.

"That's a noticeable shot, even for him," said Miami coach Erik Spoelstra. "The Udonis (Haslem) did a great job of keeping his chest in front of him and forcing him into a foulaway."

So while Wade found offensive help from Rush and James, the Mavs only other starter in double figures was Shawn Marion with 10.

"We've got to make baskets that didn't go down," said Kidd, explaining the need to supply some offense did for Nowitzki. "Think he's doing his part, everyone else has to pitch in."

"IT'S ABOUT TIME!" SAY TAXPAYERS.

NEW YORK — On Monday, June 6th, Federal Agents arrested billionaire media mogul and dictator-for-life Michael R. Bloomberg in a sweeping 800,000-page indictment that includes an impressive array of criminal complaints, from manslaughter (the preventable deaths of 200 children killed under his "supervision" at ACS; the scandalous deaths of 2 firemen in the Deutsche Bank scandal; the deaths of hundreds of rescue workers at Ground Zero after Bloomberg told everyone the air was totally safe; the mayor's flooding NYC's streets with dangerous criminals he claimed he "corrected" in his Dept of "Correction") to securities fraud and thousands of white collar crimes from anti-trust violations at Bloomberg L.P., to money laundering (in the "Haggerty-Gate" scandal) to felony fraud. (For instance it was uncovered that Bloomberg invested city pension funds into Wall Street firms owned by his closest pals — and which Mayor Bloomberg personally owned millions of stocks.

"This case features a swathe of corruption the likes of which this nation has never seen before" said U.S. Attorney Preet Bahara. "I suspect that, if not for his riches and graft and donations — aka BRIBES — he could never have kept his unprecedented corruption hidden this long." "Bloomberg should've been jailed just for the CITYTIME scandal" State senator Tony Avella offered. "I mean he literally stole \$4 BILLION TAXDOLLARS just to buy the richest sports team in history — The Yankees — a new stadium! And he got caught lying to the Feds and the IRS to steal extra taxdollars in that debacle alone! I mean, how do you claim that stadiums — which sit EMPTY 300 days a year! — are good for our economy??"

In what is perhaps unprecedented in legal circles, the Feds are also charging Bloomberg under TREASON statutes, both for his corrupt overthrowing of Term Limits in 2008 — essentially canceling democracy outright — and the shocking amounts of money spent to cheat three elections. (For instance, in 2009, Mr. Bloomberg spent \$110 MILLION (which excludes the \$200 million of taxmoney the incumbent mayor used on self-promotion) versus Democrat Bill Thompson's \$6 million.) Legal scholars say it's a clear case that the mayor was "canceling" all our legal principles of "fair" elections. (continued on page A6)
